## The Water Framework and Flood Risk Directives: an overview of main institutional and organizational requirements

- Member States shall bring into a single regulatory framework water management and protection
- The river basin is the ecological unit determining the government structure for water management and (as preferred option) for flood risk management
- Water management shall be based on the integrated nature of the water cycle and its links with land use
- Competent water authorities shall be in charge of undertaking and coordinating prescribed activities within river basin districts



#### The implementation path of the Water Framework and Flood Risk Directives in Italy

#### Key critical points:

- a) Decree 152/2006 (implementing the WFD) and Decree 49/2010 (implementing the FRD):
- establishment of River Basin Districts and *District Authorities*
- clash of interests along centre-periphery
- public information and consultation
- Sectoral versus integrated approach
- b) Other related recent and ongoing water reforms (Law 166/2009; Law 42/2010; Decree 106/2011)



## Two inspiring EU water directives consideranda for the Italian ongoing reforms and implementation process

Water Framework Directive: (considerandum n.1)

"Water is not a commercial product like any other but, rather, a heritage which must be protected, defended and treated as such"

#### Flood Risk Directive: (considerandum n. 3)

"It is feasible and desirable to reduce the risk of adverse consequences associated with floods. However, measures to reduce these risks should, as far as possible, be coordinated throughout a river basin if they are to be effective"
