

RETICULA

Reti ecologiche, greening e green infrastructure nella pianificazione del territorio e del paesaggio

RETICULA is a technical and scientific online journal with dissemination purposes. It is addressed to all people who are interested in the topic of ecological connectivity in relation to territorial planning in the broadest sense of the term. Technicians of central and local administrations and all the professionals involved in the planning process are the priority target of the magazine.

Paper, therefore, must comply with a content and language level appropriate to the above mentioned characteristics, purpose and target audience.

The paper may take the form of:

1. an original research;
2. an innovation in planning methodologies (or sector);
3. a good practice;
4. an example of projects planned or already carried out;
5. a policy or governance tool that facilitates or pre-orders the activities referred to in the above paragraphs.

The paper should meet the following publishing criteria:

AUTHOR	The name, written in full, must be accompanied by the affiliation and the e-mail.
TITLE	The title must be concise (should not exceed 100 characters including spaces).
ABSTRACT AND KEYWORDS	- Abstract must not exceed 800 characters including spaces; - Maximum 4 keywords must be given.
TEXT	- The text must be typed using Word format; - Paper must be between 15.000-25.000 characters including spaces; - It is heartily recommend using hyperlinks to other information sources in order to ensure further details.
ARTWORK and TABLES	- Artwork is mandatory; - Provide maximum 5 elements (pictures, graphs, tables, readable plans, maps, box, etc.); - Submit each element as a separate file in JPG or TIF format with a minimum resolution of 300 dpi (max size 13x18 cm); - The tables must be sent in Word or Excel format; - Number the illustrations according to their sequence in the text; - Provide captions to illustrations separately, numbering them according to the corresponding element. Each caption must not exceed 250 characters including spaces and, when necessary, must include the source of the illustration; - Point out where in the text it would be preferable to insert the illustration.
FOOTNOTES	- Footnotes must be limited in length and number. In substitution you can use as much as possible hyperlinks; - All footnotes must be ordered at the end of the manuscript and not at the end of each page.
REFERENCES	References must be checked against the text to ensure: (a) that the spelling of authors' names and the dates given are consistent and (b) that all authors quoted in the text (in date order if more than one) are given in the reference list and vice versa

	<p>Reference style</p> <p><u>Text</u> All citations in the text should refer to: 1. Single author: the author's name (without initials, unless there is ambiguity) and the year of publication; 2. Two authors: both authors' names and the year of publication; 3. Three or more authors: first author's name followed by 'et al.' and the year of publication. Citations in the text may be made directly (or parenthetically). Groups of references should be listed first chronologically, then alphabetically. Examples: 'as demonstrated (Allan and Jones, 1999; Allan, 1999, 2000a, 2000b). Kramer et al. (2010) have recently shown'</p> <p><u>List</u> References should be arranged first alphabetically and then further sorted chronologically if necessary. More than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication. Examples: - Reference to a journal publication: Van der Geer J., Hanraads J.A.J., Lupton R.A., 2010. <i>The art of writing a scientific article</i>. J. Sci. Commun. 163, 51–59. - Reference to a book: Strunk Jr. W., White E.B., 2000. <i>The Elements of Style fourth ed.</i> Longman, New York. - Reference to a chapter in an edited book: Mettam G.R., Adams L.B., 2009. <i>How to prepare an electronic version of your article</i>. In: Jones B.S., Smith R.Z. (Eds.), <i>Introduction to the Electronic Age</i>. E-Publishing Inc., New York, pp. 281–304.</p> <p>If the publications quoted in the text can be downloaded please provide hyperlink.</p> <p><u>Web references</u> As a minimum, the full URL should be given and the date when the reference was last accessed. Web references must be listed separately (e.g., after the reference list) under a different heading.</p>
<p>MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The manuscript must be submitted in a single Word file containing Author/s, title, abstract, keywords, text, footnotes and references; - Send all the art work in a separate folder; - The manuscript and the visual elements folder must be submitted to the editorial board at reticula@isprambiente.it.

Authors are requested to read RETICULA Ethical Code (at <http://www.isprambiente.gov.it/it/pubblicazioni/periodici-tecnici/reticula>) and to respect its contents.

The Editors reserve the right to modify accepted manuscripts that do not conform to scientific, technical, stylistic or grammatical standards, and these minor alterations may not be seen by the authors until the proof stage. In case of substantial modification of the manuscript, the author will be contacted.

It is, anyway, final opinion of the editorial board to publish the contribution.
