








Transport-related CO₂ Emissions of the Tourism Sector






One Planet Sustainable Tourism Programme is one of the six programmes of 10-Year Framework of Programmes on Sustainable Consumption and Production (SDG 12)

Objectives:

- ✓ To deliver a UN mandate on supporting and accelerating the shift to sustainable consumption and production patterns in tourism
- ✓ To tackle the challenges of pollution, biodiversity loss and climate change
- ✓ To report the annual progress to the High-level Political Forum of the United Nations Economic and Social Council

Accelerating climate action:

- ✓ A declaration promoting consistent action
- ✓ A catalyst for increased urgency about the need to accelerate climate action in tourism and to secure strong actions and commitment to support the global goals to halve emissions over the next decade and reach Net Zero emissions as soon as possible before 2050
- ✓ Strategies to <u>Measure</u>, <u>Decarbonise</u>, <u>Regenerate</u>, <u>Collaborate</u>, Finance
- √ 500+ signatories
- ✓ Annual reporting

Accelerating climate action in tourism



Signatories commit to:

- ✓ Support the global commitment to halve emissions by 2030 and reach Net Zero by 2050 at the latest
- ✓ Deliver climate action plans within 12 months from becoming a signatory
- ✓ **Align with 5 pathways**: measure, decarbonize, regenerate, collaborate, finance
- ✓ Report publicly on an annual basis on progress against targets and actions
- ✓ Work in a collaborative spirit, share good practices and solutions

Building a circular economy of plastics in tourism



Tackling plastic pollution:

- ✓ A vision of a circular economy for plastics
- ✓ Engage the value chain to strategize to <u>Eliminate</u>, <u>Innovate</u>, <u>Circulate</u>
- ✓ Collaborate and invest to increase the recycling and composting rates for plastics
- √ 100+ signatories
- ✓ Annual reporting

Signatories commit to:

- ✓ Eliminate problematic or unnecessary plastic items and packaging
- ✓ Integrate **reuse models** or reusable alternatives
- Engage the value chain to embrace reusable, recyclable, compostable
- ✓ Request increased amount of recycled content across plastics used
- ✓ Collaborate to increase plastics recycling and composting rates
- ✓ Report publicly and annually on progress made

Global Roadmap on Food Waste Reduction in the Tourism Sector

Global Roadmap on Food Waste Reduction in the Tourism Sector and Supporting Tools provides:

✓ A global reference for the scaling up of sustainable food management in the tourism sector, including the reduction of food waste, a Global Roadmap on Food Waste Reduction in the Tourism Sector is being developed.

The Roadmap will encompass a systemic approach with regards to sustainable food management, notably in connection with sustainable procurement and sustainable diets in addition to food waste.




